



3 Population change 2006 to 2016: Edinburgh, Edinburgh city region and Scotland






4 Components of population change from 2006 to 2016





5 Population change for UK cities, percentage and number, from 2006 to 2016






7 Projected population of Edinburgh by age band 2016 to 2039 (2014 based projections)





10 Origin of overseas workers registered in Edinburgh 2014-16







■ Edinburgh registrations as % of Scottish total





13 Economic status of residents as a percentage of population aged 16 to 64 years in Edinburgh and UK cities 2017







15 Percentage of residents aged 16 to 64 years in employment in UK cities 2017





16 Model based estimate of unemployment in Edinburgh 2007 to 2016




17 Model based estimates of unemployment in UK cities 2007 to 2016 (best and worst major UK cities)





19 Percentage of working age population claiming benefits 2013 to 2016




20 Percentage of 16 to 24 year olds claiming benefits 2013 to 2016





25 People in employment and top five industries by locality areas 2015







26 Gross value added (GVA) in Edinburgh 2015 (£ millions)





27 Edinburgh GVA as percentage of Scotland GVA 2015




28 GVA per capita in major UK cities 2015

29 Edinburgh Business demography births and deaths 2005 to 2015




30 New Business five year survival rates in UK cities from 2010 to 2015



31 Percentage registered enterprises by employee size band 2016




32 Change in number of registered enterprises by employee size band from 2011 to 2016



37 Average gross disposable income per resident in major UK cities 2015





40 Edinburgh footfall by location and time segment average day August 2017





42 Percentage change in footfall on last year for Princes Street by month 2016 to 2017



Relationship between footfall and retail sales in Edinburgh reveals that annual changes in footfall do not always correspond to a similar change in retail sales. In May 2016 footfall on Princes Street was up by 3.3% on May 2015, but over the same period retail sales fell by 5.4%.

43 Edinburgh retail sales % turnover on last year from city centre retailers 2016 to 2017




44 Number of pupils in Edinburgh schools 2017




46 Number of school pupils by Edinburgh locality 2016








51 Students enrolled in Edinburgh College 2016

50 Students enrolled in higher education institutions in Edinburgh 2015 by domicile



52 Percentage of workforce educated to degree level or above in major UK cities 2016







53 Higher Education students by domicile in Edinburgh 2016





54 Higher education students by domicile in Edinburgh as percentage of Scotland total 2016









60 Accommodation used by GB visitors to Scotland 2015








62 Estimated number of overseas visitors to UK cities annual average (2014 to 2016)





63 Overseas visitors to Edinburgh by purpose of visit (2014 to 2016)




64 Percentage of overseas visitors to UK cities on holiday as purpose of visit (2014 to 2016)


















80 Average sunshine hours per day by three month period

82 Annual percentage change in sunshine and rainfall, August 2016 to July 2017







84 Number of households in Edinburgh 2007 to 2016




85 Percentage change in number of households in Scottish cities and Scotland from 2007 to 2016

87 Number of properties per hectare by Edinburgh locality 2016








88 Number of properties by type in Edinburgh 2016



90 Percentage of property types by Edinburgh locality area 2016




89 Number of properties by type and Edinburgh locality area 2016





92 Edinburgh average house price by building type April 2017










96 House building numbers Edinburgh 2012 to 2016 (new start builds)

97 Number of house sales in Edinburgh by month







99 Household composition 2015







102 Geographical reach of charities registered in Edinburgh 2017








105 Rail passenger numbers (millions) Edinburgh stations 2012 to 2016

107 Passenger numbers (millions) Edinburgh airport 2011 to 2016












113 Frequency of tram use in Edinburgh 2016





114 Tram passenger use, average number of passenger per day per stop on tram network 2016




115 Frequency of tram use in Edinburgh 2016

116 Average download speed in major UK cities 2015 (Mbps)






