A Trading Standards Officer has visited Bonnington Mains Quarry, Cliftonhall Road, Newbridge on the following dates within the requested period;

12/09/2018 - To discuss Weights and Measures matters Site was still being fitted out with Weights and Measure equipment.

01/03/2019 - To discuss Weights and Measures matters – to confirm that the site was operational.

04/03/2019 - To carry out a test of the weighbridge against the provisions of the Non-Automatic Weighing Instrument Regulations 2016.

17/01/2020 - To carry out a test of the weighbridge against the provisions of the Non-Automatic Weighing Instrument Regulations 2016.

In terms of Planning Enforcement, the team has carried out three visits to the site in the last five years as follows:

08/03/2019 - Site visit in connection with enforcement investigation into 'Alleged unlawful erection of a boundary fence', enforcement reference 19/00101/EOPDEV

Late 2019 and 04/03/2020 - Site visits in connection with enforcement investigation into Non-compliance with Condition re. Dust Clouds, enforcement reference 19/00691/ECOND. The first visit was an unannounced visit relating to dust from the quarry, but as the site manager was not on site it was just a case of obtaining contact details. The second visit was a walk round tour and observation of a blast to see the impact of the blast and to note the dust resulting from it.
