Hi,

I wonder if you could help.

We are working with Edinburgh World Heritage to located bin hubs in the New and Old Town of Edinburgh within the World Heritage site and to minimise the visual impact of the bins we have been asked to investigate colours of the bin lids.

While black and grey are ok there is some issues with the green and the purple.

Just wondering if you have available a deeper green for mixed recycling lids.

For the glass it might be possible to have only the flap of the glass bin in purple with the rest of the lid in black. The type of aperture with the holes and the stickers will help residents to have enough information on the type of material the bin accept in the case the flap goes loose.

Any information on the availability and on the associated costs will be much appreciated it.

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How bin hubs will look

We recognise the uniqueness of the World Heritage Site and want to ensure waste and recycling services do not undermine the character of the area but also increase the amount of waste that we recycle.

We are looking at ways to minimise the visual impact of the bins, such as changes to bin lid colours and corral structures to suit the local streetscape.

Other measures are being considered, in conjunction with Road Safety and accessibility requirements.
