Any internal or external correspondence and paperwork for the three months in advance of and during the funding bid for Spaces for People funding (managed by Sustrans) including how it was perceived to meet the criteria for such funding.

(This is relevant because the closure does not objectively appear to meet any of the key criteria and there is a perception that it was done more as an unsuccessful experiment to close roads in order to reduce car use and increase cycling/walking in the city rather than as a response to the dangers of covid.)

(This is relevant because every day the road remains closed causes further delay, congestion, inconvenience to all road users and pollution.)

The Transport and Environment Committee approved the recommendations within the report with a <u>Coalition Addendum and an Amendment by the Green party</u>
