Members of the Edinburgh Slavery and Colonialism Legacy Review Group have raised concerns about their personal safety, and the safety of family members, should their identities by publicised in connection with this work, which is subject to high levels of media interest currently. As a result, the Council is working to establish safeguarding procedures to give them confidence that their wellbeing is of paramount concern and practical support is available if required.
