In 2020/21 the budget was entirely spent in March i.e. only in the last month of the financial year.

In 2021/22 the budget was entirely spent in February.

Please note the budget does not indicate a limit on spend for school clothing grants. Anyone who applies and qualifies for this payment will receive it. The budget has also increased significantly over the time that you have asked about from £283k in 2011/12 to £1.123m in 2021/22, reflecting the increase in both the number of payments and the award per child.

The service are continually looking at ways to increase uptake including targeted campaigns, simpler application processes and extension of single financial assessment to ensure we are supporting as many citizens access this important payment.
