How does this local authority measure the output of this training?

We do not hold this information. There is no requirement to record this output.

Broken down by year, from 2017 to 2022, what amount of training in CPR for school aged children has been provided.

Unfortunately, we are unable to provide you with the information you have requested as the cost to the Council of locating, retrieving and providing you with the information exceeds the statutory maximum of £600.

This information would have to be collected from schools as we do not hold this detail centrally. There is also no requirement to hold this information in schools.

There are 123 schools and, it is estimated that it would take 10 minutes for each of the 5 years to provide the information taking a total of 102.5 hours.
