## 'Trans: When Ideology Meets Reality' by Helen Joyce

Hi Cleo,

I'm emailing because I've come across something and wasn't sure who to contact and thought it would be interesting to get your perspective and thoughts since you're a part of the Equalities and Diversity group. I've just seen that the libraries have a copy of Helen's Joyce's book 'Trans' on order. I'm not sure if anyone is aware but this book is filled misinformation regarding trans people, transphobia, and antisemitism (for example it suggests three Jewish billionaires are funding 'gender ideology', and that puberty blockers cause sterilisation). Just recently the Mail Online posted a review of Joyce's book with the title:

'The author brave enough to take on the trans lobby: New book warns that children are forcibly sterilised, women are at risk of rape and doctors are 'terrorised' as a result of people being allowed to choose their own gender'

These types of books do have a harmful impact on marginalised communities. We've seen this with the rise in transphobia in Scotland and the rest of the UK. REDACTED, I'm left feeling uneasy at the thought that we'd have books like this that seek to misinform and fuel bigotry. And REDACTED community, seeing a book like that in our collection does make me feel concerned REDACTED, and verging on feeling deeply unwelcomed in libraries. I don't believe this was ordered maliciously, I'm sure this could be just through automation, or someone genuinely is interested in learning about trans lives and trans people but doesn't know where to begin and, given the level of attention this has received, thought this book would be a good place to start. There are some fantastic books about trans lives by trans people now days such as Laura Kate Dales 'Uncomfortable Labels' or 'Gender Euphoria' which she recently edited; 'Trans Love' edited by Freiya Benson; 'They/Them/Their' by Eris Young; 'Trans Britain' edited by Christine Burns; and Shon Faye's soon to be published book 'The Transgender Issue' is supposed to be superb. There's so many great trans literature by trans people, it seems a shame to instead have a book about trans people by someone who isn't trans that seeks to spread misinformation and hate.

I'd really like to hear your thoughts and opinions on this. I'm always available to discuss this further as well if you'd like.

- This book has been selected via our supplier selection process according to criteria Library Resource Management set on behalf of Edinburgh Libraries.

- There is no 'malicious' intent or intended bias on the part of the library supplier or LRM in how books are selected. Our processes are open to scrutiny and we welcome feedback from all quarters, both internal and external

- The book has been issued by a recognised publisher
- This book has been widely reviewed and reported and has obviously divided opinion as many titles do, both historically and currently.

Whilst the quote sent supports a negative view of the content, there are many reviews of a more positive nature which do also reflect the challenging nature of the book.

"I was sexually mature. What I mean by sexually mature is that I knew about sex. From six up, I used to kiss other guys in the neighbourhood, make out with them, and perform oral sex on them. I liked it. I used to love oral. And I touched their you-know-whats. We were really young, but that's what we did"

I said I would seek some advice on the matter and get back to him, I can send the book up if you would like though that paragraph seems to be what he objected to the most.

This may be exacerbated by the fact that due to the library Covid reshuffle the teen section is right beside the children's section.
