We do not hold this information. The cost of satisfying FOI queries is not recorded separately.

Please provide details of the subject of the enquiry and the reason for classification as vexatious for all such requests for each of the years between 2013-2023?

There is a specific exemption under FOISA for requests which are considered to be vexatious, and we hold the following:

05/11/2018 – Procurement of services
The effect of harassing the authority
07/11/2018 – Documents regarding the decision for a previous request
The effect of harassing the authority

In regard to the EIRS, there is no specific exception for vexatious requests and these are recorded as manifestly unreasonable. There are no EIRS which have been classified as vexatious.

Please note that in line with the Council's retention policy, requests for information under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA) and the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 (the EIRS) is deleted after 3 years or after 6 years if the request is subject to a review. Therefore, information prior to June 2018 is not held.

What criteria or guidelines do you use when deciding if a request is 'vexatious' or not? Could you supply copies of any guidelines or policy documentation relating to this?
