

Good afternoon,

Residents living adjacent to the proposed development location have asked me to echo their concerns about this application.

- There is some concern that the colours proposed for use on the pitches will be too bright for this location within the conservation area.
- The principal concern is that the height of the flood lighting columns is proposed to be fixed rather than like the current set-up being 'telescopic' in that they retract. The concern is that the fixed height will have a detrimental impact on the conservation area and there may interfere in public views of the skyline. There is a desire that, should the lighting need to be replaced, that the columns can retract.

In response to objectors concerns about light pollution, as shown in Drawing 'SS3072 04 - Spillage Comparison' (planning portal reference: 05-SPILLAGE COMPARISON) there would be a significant reduction in light spillage when compared against the existing floodlights. Within the site, all light spillage would be cut off at or near the external site boundary. Therefore, the proposed lighting columns would provide a **betterment** to the existing position in terms of light pollution. I have included an excerpt from the drawing below which demonstrates this.

The use of telescopic columns would have no bearing on levels of light pollution. The new lighting columns and their fittings result in less light seepage (and therefore less light pollution to neighbouring areas as shown above), have the benefit of being more slender than the telescopic columns and offer greater control over light levels than the existing lights.

We trust this helps clarify but let us know if you have any further queries.
