Then income may be used to support the delivery, either directly or indirectly, of the scheme's objectives. If, after objectives have been met, any surplus may require to be repaid to Transport Scotland.

The City of Edinburgh Council and DEFRA routinely collects data on pollutants NO₂, PM₁₀, PM_{2.5} and SO₂. The data is from two types of monitoring: automatic monitoring stations which give near real-time concentrations, and non-automatic monitoring (nitrogen dioxide - NO₂) which gives annual mean concentrations across a wide spatial area of the city. It should be noted that passive diffusion tubes (non-automatic) are deployed and analysed in the laboratory each month; however, the monthly data cannot be used to compare monthly NO₂ concentrations, assess monthly trends in concentration, calculate monthly rolling annual mean values, or assess monthly data against the annual air quality standard. Such assessments and calculations will misinterpret the data and could produce misleading conclusions on air quality. The methodology is relevant for annual means only.
