The Council has enforced on-street electric vehicle charging bays where a Traffic Regulation Order in place since 2022. We have provided PCN figures for contravention 14 – parked in an electric vehicle charging place during restricted hours without charging.

Please note that the charge at which a PCN is issued is not indicative of the sum paid. This is because PCN charges are reduced by 50% if paid within 14 days but will escalate if not paid.
