Playgrounds

The Council currently recognises 172 distinct playparks within its playpark estate.

- Accessibility for children with disabilities
 - 134 playparks have a fully bounded safety surface (wetpour, carpet, or matting), which enables wheelchair access.
 - 19 playparks provide a combination of bounded surface and loose-fill material (bark mulch or sand), offering partial accessibility.
 - 19 playparks are surfaced exclusively with loose-fill materials, which do not provide easy wheelchair access.

As part of our ongoing commitment to accessibility, when loose-fill surfacing reaches the end of its service life, we aim—subject to budget—to replace it with a bounded safety surface. While accessibility guidance is incorporated into all new playpark designs, we do not currently classify playparks, equipment, or environments as "inclusive." Manufacturers may market equipment as inclusive; however, we do not formally record this information, as it may be considered a subjective assessment rather than an objective measure of inclusion.

Public toilets
