Responsibility for accommodating all other people seeking asylum sits primarily with the Home Office and, in Scotland, with its contracted accommodation provider, Mears Group although in limited circumstances, local authorities can acquire that responsibility.

The above figures total the number of people seeking asylum accommodated by the Council. The numbers relate primarily to unaccompanied asylum-seeking children with the small number of other people seeking asylum included in brackets.

People included in the above figures have been placed in a range of accommodation including residential houses, foster care, host families, commissioned flats and temporary homeless accommodation as above.
