The Council does not hold information on registered capacity of breakfast clubs or after school clubs. This information is held by the organisation delivering the breakfast club or after school club. If the breakfast club or after school club is registered with the Care Inspectorate, they will be registered to provide a certain number of places which will be recorded on the Care Inspectorate website.

Operating days per week (average):

Most breakfast clubs or after school clubs operate 5 days a week. However, some after school clubs or breakfast clubs may not operate on certain days of the week if there is not enough demand to make it financially viable to provide a service on those days e.g. Fridays when a lot of parents don't work due to working part time or compressed working.

The Council does not hold information about fee structure for breakfast clubs and after school clubs this is set and held by organisations who deliver the service.

£263,778 council breakfast club funding is distributed amongst school managed breakfast clubs. Distribution of funding is linked to the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation deciles 1 – 10.

This methodology directs funding to schools with higher levels of families in deciles 1 - 4 within their school community.

Out of school care providers can apply for council funding to support children with Additional Support Needs to attend an out of school care provider. They need to meet the criteria to be approved funding. The total funding for 2025-26 is £196,000.
