At the Transport and Environment Committee meeting on 30 January 2025 under item 8.1 Air Quality Annual Progress Report in response to Councillor questions, it was stated that additional monitoring points had been added to monitor air quality on the periphery of the LEZ.

Please provide the location and type of these new monitoring points, when they were installed and when the results will be available

Beginning in 2018, the Council (in association with the Scottish Environment Protection Agency) increased air quality monitoring and developed an air dispersion model as part of the development of Edinburgh's LEZ. Monitoring locations were added on an annual basis until 2022.

Details of monitoring locations and results are provided in the <u>Air Quality Annual Progress</u> <u>Reports</u>.

It was also stated in the report for this item that it was planned to focus on vehicle engine idling on Clean Air Day 2025. Please provide information on the actions taken to meet this commitment.

The Council promoted the issue of engine idling through a digital campaign video on social media (X and Facebook) on Clean Air Day 2025. Officers are also deployed on street to tackle engine idling where possible.
