The most recent maintenance records for the Coltbridge Viaduct

The most recent inspection was in January 2025 and the inspection report is attached.

The most recent maintenance works were undertaken by Barhale Limited in 2019. The scope included waterproofing, drainage, resurfacing, masonry, new lighting columns, masonry repairs, repainting of the bridge parapets and ancillary works to fencing and adjacent access paths.

All information which was passed to the council's advisors Jacobs concerning the Coltbridge Viaduct.

A desktop study based on maintenance records was carried out by Jacobs no further information was passed over. Jacobs were involved in Edinburgh Strategic Sustainable Transport Study phases one and two which considered the Roseburn path and structures along the northern section of the proposed tram route so already had knowledge of the structures.
