Gavin / Cliff

As discussed in Alan's absence I have taken this instruction to organise either Road Operations or Street Lighting operatives to remove flags along Calder Road.

I can confirm that staff have raised the same wellbeing concerns as they did on the 12th of September and on this basis are unwilling to remove.

The concerns raised below have been experienced by other authorities and are supported by all Managers within Roads & Infrastructure.

- Threat of violence or intimidation whilst carrying out duties
- Video footage of works being undertaken shared on social media
- Repercussions out with work due to the above

They will however inspect and assess these flags this evening ascertaining if they are a danger to the public or the asset.

The below process which has been issued to Cllrs and followed over the last 2 weeks is in alignment with other local authorities in Scotland and until we can assure our employees safety and a Senior Management instruction is given, I believe this should be adhered to. "The process that has been agreed by the Head of Roads & Infrastructure is:

- 1. Following receipt of a report, the street will be checked to determine whether the location and height of the flag is a danger to the travelling public (e.g. is it obscuring a traffic sign or traffic signal);
- 2. If the flag is found to be a danger to the travelling public, owing to the issues experienced in ______, where the Council staff have been threatened with violence when trying to remove flags, Police Scotland will be contacted to protect the operatives from abuse during its removal;
- 3. If the flag is not a danger to the travelling public, no action will be taken."

I note that APSE have just issued an invitation to authorities to discuss the issues around the "Raise the Flag Campaign " on the 8th of October which senior managers could attend . Our supply chain has been approached to help with the issues, and none are willing to assist for the same reason and reputational risk
