What criteria are currently being used to allocate council housing since the suspension of the Key to Choice advertising system in April 2025?

Homes that become vacant and are deemed accessible are initially passed to the Home Accessibility Referral Team to see if they are suitable for any applicants with Gold Priority. If there are no suitable Gold Applicants, they are passed back to the locality. Non accessible homes are sent with a direct allocation request from localities to the Temporary Accommodation (TA) Team. The TA team will then nominate homeless applicants that are in unsuitable accommodation or have been in TA long term.
