## 58757 Council's Carbon-Reduction Approach

Further to your recent disclosure of electricity usage for the period 1-April 2024 to 31-March 2025, I would like to request additional information in the public interest regarding the Council's carbon-reduction approach.

For the same period (April 2024 – March 2025), please confirm:

Whether the electricity purchased by the Council was sourced as standard ("brown") electricity rather than via REGO-backed or other certified green renewable tariffs.

The City of Edinburgh Council purchases electricity via a 'Standard' electricity tariff or 'Brown' tariff.

If so, please state the reasons for not procuring REGO-backed or green renewable electricity. In particular, was this decision due to cost premiums, or were other factors involved?

The Council must report the carbon used per year, so the carbon intensity factor of the grid is the reporting factor, not if you are on a "Brown" or "Green" tariff. Due to this, the additional cost of the 'Green' tariff was deemed unnecessary.
