We would be obliged if you can provide us with the following details in regard to notices/Orders that have been made by City of Edinburgh Council under the legislation listed above:

- Notices or Orders that remain extant as at 9th December 2025
- Notices or Orders that have been complied with and have monies owed to City of Edinburgh Council as at 9th December 2025
- Notices or Orders that have invoices pending in respect of works carried out by or on behalf of City of Edinburgh Council to resolve the matter as at 9th December 2025

If it is not possible for the details of outstanding monies to be confirmed, we would be obliged if you can provide us with the following details:

- all notices served or orders made by City of Edinburgh Council, from 1st September 2025 to 9th December 2025 under the legislation listed above

Wherever possible we would be grateful if the information could be prepared to include the following:

- Reference numbers
- Addresses of the subjects the actions are served over
- Unique Property Reference Number (UPRN)
- Summary descriptions of the nature of the works/contravention
- Relevant dates
- Status of the action
- Amounts owed to the council (when available)

There have been no Notices or Orders issued in relation to the specified sections of the Housing (Scotland) Act 1987; therefore, no Notices or Orders remain extant, have monies owed or invoices pending at the date specified.

It may be worth noting that there have been significant legislative developments since the 1987 Act, including the implementation and empowerment of the Housing and Property Chamber (First Tier Tribunal) to deal with repair issues in Scotland.
