Copies of Local Case Reviews (LCRs) conducted by The Access Place (TAP) relating to drug-related deaths in temporary or supported accommodation, including PSEAG decisions arising.

This information will not be provided as I consider that this, together with other information, could lead to identification of an individual and the release of such data would breach Data Protection legislation.

APC improvement plan and minutes of APC Quality Assurance / Learning & Development / Lived Experience sub-committees where housing, homelessness, temporary accommodation, and drug-related deaths were discussed (Feb 2024 – present), particularly minutes of “Protecting through Partnerships” events (Feb and Oct 2025).

We do not hold this information. There has been nothing mentioned in any ASP committee / subcommittee or forum relating to drug deaths, temporary accommodation, housing or homelessness since February 2024. The two APC events covered the housing emergency with data on homelessness – there are no minutes as these were awareness raising events.

Re-inspection reports and associated action plans referred to as “significant improvements noted in November 2024.”

Briefings provided by the Alcohol & Drug Partnership (ADP) to staff carrying out Adult Support & Protection duties regarding substance misuse and drug-related deaths (2023–2025).

There were 4 briefings held. This was a joint initiative between EADP, the Child Protection Committee, Adult Protection Committee and Equally Safe. The briefings were delivered live and were not recorded. Presenters were external and we do not have copies of the slides they used, however, flyers for 2 of the briefings have been located and are attached. The subjects covered and number of attendees were as follows:

- Young People’s Substance Use, with 39 participants
- New drugs trends and increased risk of harm (novel opioids and benzodiazepines) with 23 participants.
- Overdose Awareness and Responses, with 55 participants
- Crack and Crack Cocaine: understanding and responding, with 63 participants.

Thematic reviews, risk assessments, or decision records explaining why a coordinated thematic review of recent drug-related deaths in temporary accommodation has not been commissioned.
