

## 59525 Skips for Cardboard Waste

We refer to the above and would be grateful if you would provide us with a copy of the following information:

Details of the design and mechanism of skips for cardboard waste at your local recycling centres, including any photographs or illustrations if available.

To clarify, we require information specifically pertaining to your 'household waste recycling centres', as opposed to recycling points at supermarkets.

Please refer to the attached photographs which show the public Cardboard Recycling area and the open top skip the cardboard should be placed in.

The skips are open top loading skips that are used throughout the waste industry.

The manner in which the cardboard is deposited into the skip, whether by a slot/letterbox mechanism or if the skip is "open" and cardboard is placed in the waste bin via an open top.

The skip is "open" and cardboard is placed in the waste bin via an open top.

Photographs of the Cardboard Recycling area and the skips where cardboard is placed are attached.

Risk assessments pertaining to the use of the skips at your local recycling centres by members of the public.

Our Risk Assessments are used by staff for all actions/work carried out on site. There are no Risk Assessments specifically for the public's use of the skips. The public are advised to follow the site rules.

The public must book a slot to use our Recycling Centres and the Site Rules are on the first page of the booking system. It is incumbent on the person booking to read them and understand them.

If there was a public facing Risk Assessment, every member of the public entering our sites would be required to read it. This would not be practical.
