This is a retrospective post as work had already started. It was believed by Edintravel that Meta Business Suite had been used to schedule the same information as the X post, to be released on their Facebook page on the evening of Friday 19/04/2026 but the post was not published. They became aware of this when a comment was made to the effect that the work had not been mentioned on the page. They subsequently advised that “the software had let us down”. There is no recorded evidence to support the attempt to schedule the post but similar failures have been experienced in the past. There was no intention to mislead anyone. The message was scheduled in good faith for release but, either through an error within the software or an error in utilising it, it did not get posted.
