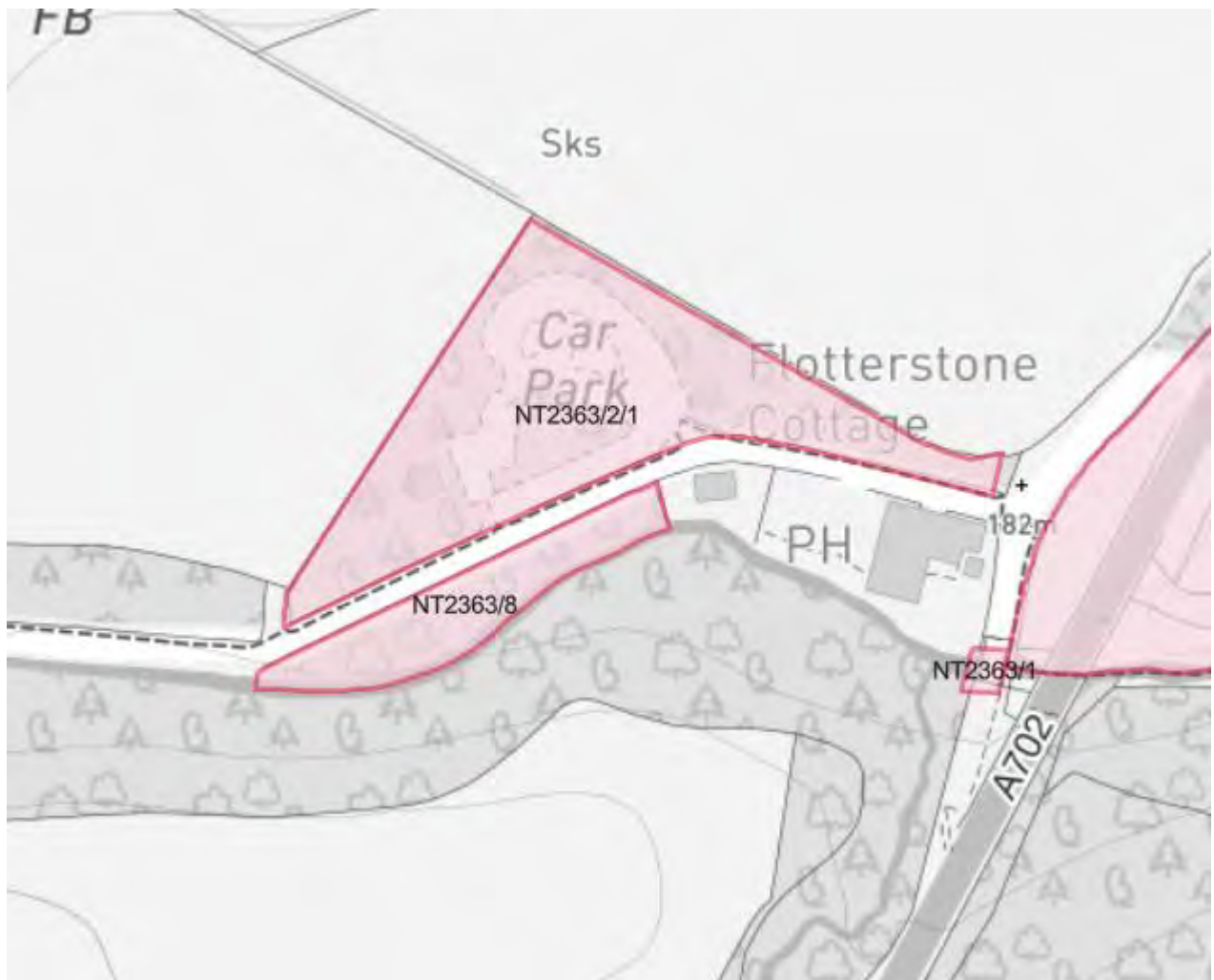

Thank you for coming another day. We appreciate your acknowledgement that there are some issues that need to be solved. Life was not gentle for hospitality businesses these past couple of years and ours is no exception. Please see some points discussed at the meeting. We will appreciate any assistance or advice on this.

- public toilets cleaning when cafe is closed.

(There would be no issues for us to do it as per agreement if we could afford having staff and stay open all days -as was planned from very beginning- but when it's just the two of us - there are 28 days of holiday a year we are entitled to and there is no one else who could take this job) • sanitary bins. (Essential as no one ever takes anything home from there) • dog waste and general waste bins for public. (Again, no ones ever takes used bbqs or poo bags home, we tried collecting it as much as we can but the amount is only growing and we can no longer cope. Waste collectors are charging extra for excess waste) • maintenance of surroundings. (Grass cut and branches clearing need to be more than twice a year. Trees inspection needed as stormy weather puts them down just too close to the building) • gutters cleaned by professionals as trees start growing on the roof. (I got an offer quote for £200, unfortunately can no longer afford it either).

- huge potholes on the driveway.

I know all these are not enjoyable subjects but we must work together to solve it. I would be more than happy to do it all myself if I only could. Unfortunately cost of living crisis touches everyone and is extremely hard on businesses. On that note, hard winter will pass and we must go into the summer stronger. As mentioned another day, I really want to do a little private garden at the back of the cafe to be able to organise some bbq and have an option of beer/wine for the summer. I will take this further to planning, just wanted to have your confirmation first.

We are looking forward to hearing your thoughts.

See below – Scottish Water claim they are only responsible for maintaining the road past the two stone pillars near the café. I ended up repairing the two bad potholes this past weekend as cars were being damaged.

I spoke to the team about it this afternoon, and Victor says that Midlothian Council installed the speed bump. Paula mentioned that she had liaised with Midlothian to repair potholes about 10 years ago.

Hopefully [REDACTED] will manage to find some documentation about who is responsible for repairs, but in the meantime if you are able to source anything from within Midlothian about responsibility for maintenance of this section of road that would greatly appreciated. Perhaps it was officially adopted by Midlothian?

I'm pretty sure it is owned by Scottish Water, by the way, I just put the bit in about us installing a footpath to see what [REDACTED] might say about it. I'm unhappy that his predecessor at SW wouldn't support traffic calming / parking restriction ideas on this stretch, and it might push them to find any internal info they have on ownership and maintenance. There could be a case to be made that if Midlothian is indeed responsible for maintenance of this stretch, then PHRP/Midlothian should be able to put in infrastructure to mitigate issues. This is becoming more urgent in the lead up to potentially charging at the car park.

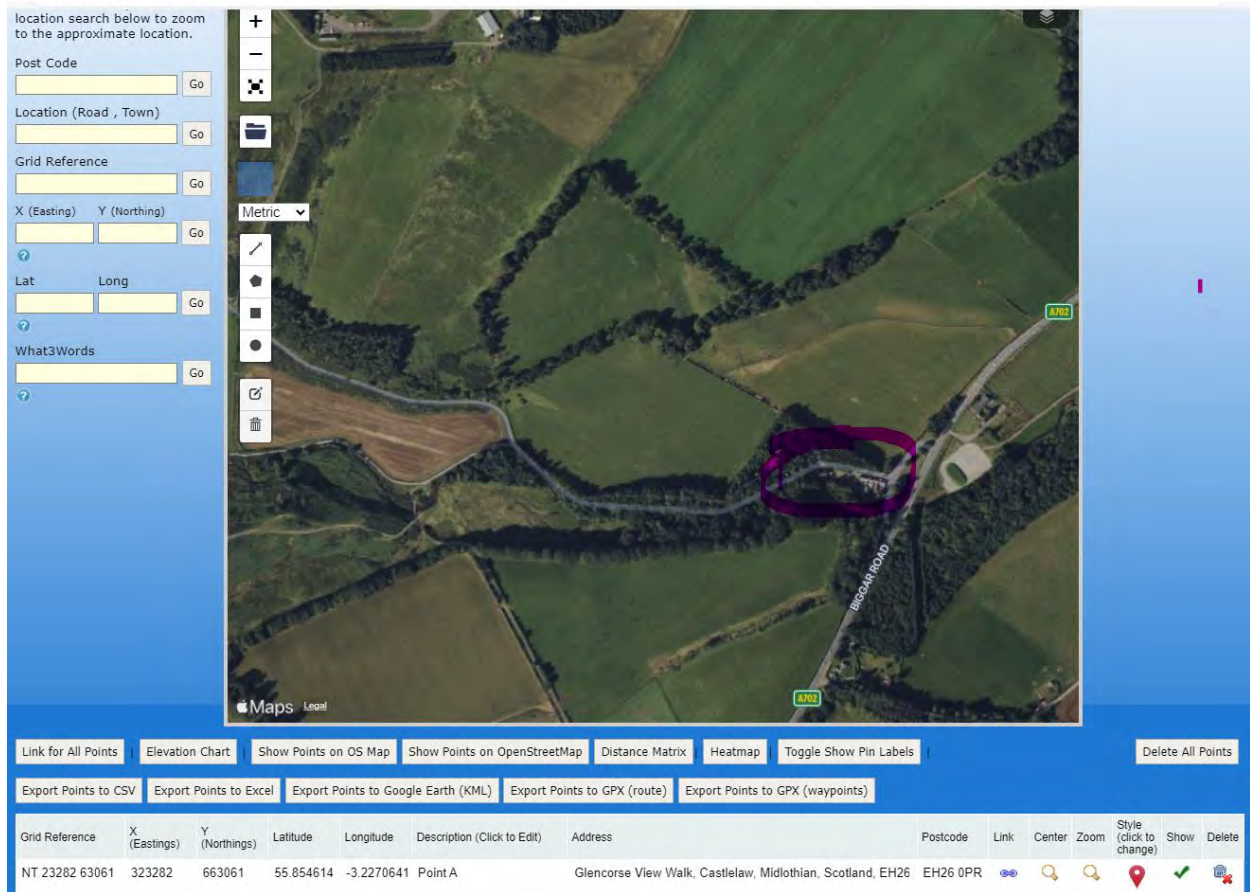

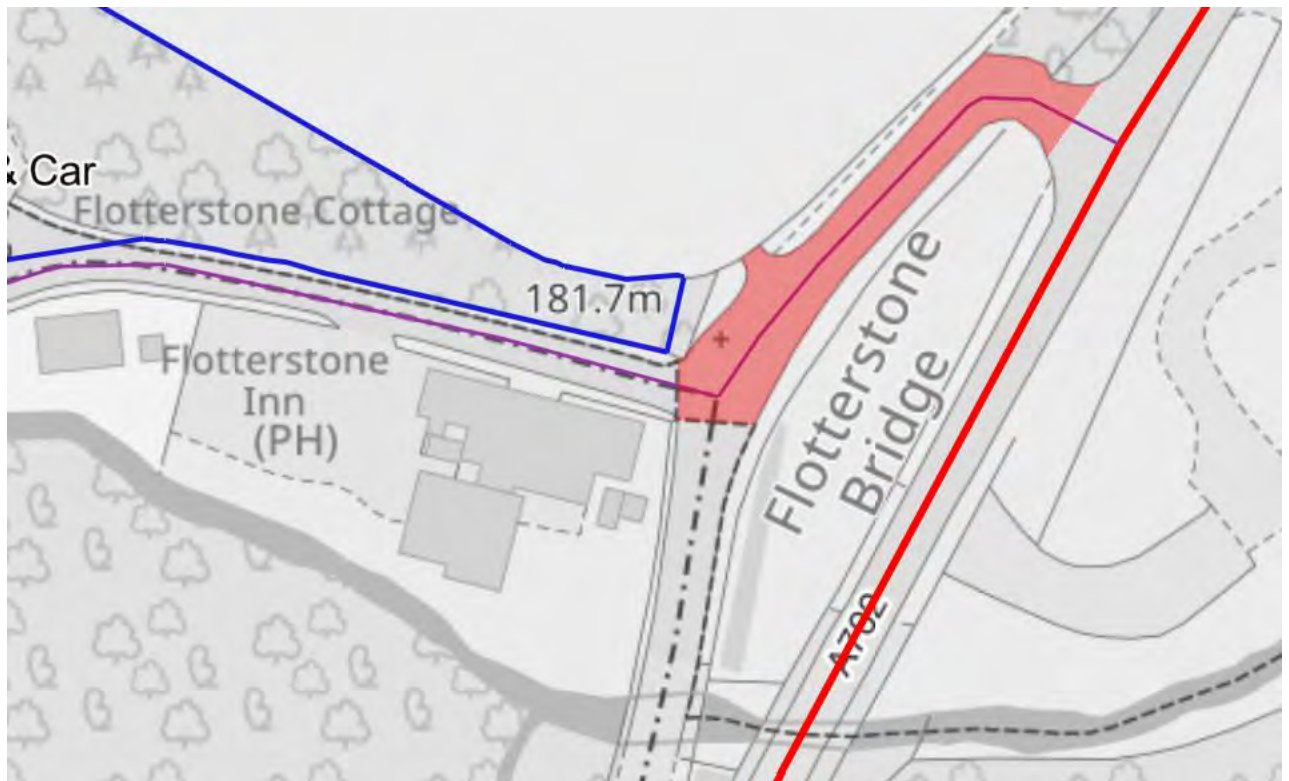

I hope all is well. This is just a quick round-up of issues in Flotterstone Glen.

- 1 Pothole in road past entrance to car park (just at two stone pillars) – this one is damaging vehicles
- 2 Water running down road causing erosion of tarmac (bottom of Buckie Brae). This is due to a blocked culvert.
- 3 Sinkhole next to road – this is starting to enlarge again
- 4 Water gathering on road at Fishery, Glencorse. This is a huge puddle – there is an under-road culvert that requires clearing.
- 5 Hole in wall opposite start of Filter Beds path – I have arranged for this to be fixed. Two tumbledown wall ends at start of Filter Beds path – I have arranged for these to be repaired.
