Why did the Council ask the other organisations that are party to the agreement for their views?

Following an OSIC Decision, services are invited to consider whether they wish to appeal the Decision through the Courts. As this matter involved other parties, it was reasonable to notify them of this. As the request related to a legal agreement between the parties, the Council notified the other parties of the imminent release of documents. The other parties were afforded the opportunity to take legal advice and to explore the matter within the timescales set out.

What views were they asked for?

Their views were not sought specifically; they were notified of the OSIC Decision Notice, that the Council would not be appealing the decision, and that the requested information would be released on 22 June 2026.

Which organisations did the Council ask?

We issued notifications to the Scottish Government and Grand Depart GB 2027 Ltd.

What was the complete response of each one to all requests?

Not applicable. Other than acknowledging receipt of the notifications issued to each party, the Council received no other correspondence from either party. No specific requests were made and no responses were received from either party following the notifications sent to them.

Why did the Council wait until it had the organisations' responses before complying with the judgement?

The delay was caused by an administrative error. The response to the judgement was authorised before the statutory deadline, however it was understood that this had been communicated to the Information Rights team when it had not, causing a delay. The delay was not caused by the Council waiting for responses from the organisations.
