(To clarify, I am requesting the 'discharge documents' for planning application 25/05871/FUL.

Discharge documents are the final copy of whatever plans/documents the Council asked for in the conditions when it gave planning permission, agreed to or approved by the Council. So they are not drafts or any other previous version of those plans/documents.

There were two legally binding conditions that the Council applied to the planning permission they gave for planning application 25/05871/FUL. One was for documents that would say how the applicant (developer) will protect the yew trees' roots during construction. The other was for a Written Scheme of Investigation to do with archaeology.

You provided me with the discharge documents for the trees in response to my first Fol request (62955). However, you have not yet provided me with the discharge documents for the archaeological Written Scheme of Investigation. So that is what I would still like to receive.)
