REMARKS :- TO BE MAINTAINED AS A RECREATION GROUND

the Committee accordingly resolved to recommend the Magistrates and Council, as Governors and Administrators of Trinity Hospital, to authorise the following additions to the establishment:—3 additional Higher Scale Trinity Hospital Pensions; 5 additional Lower Scale Trinity Hospital Pensions; 2 additional Molleson Trust Pensions; and 2 additional Rennald Weir Pensions. If this recommendation is approved, the Committee crave a remit to make nominations for these additional Pensions at the election of pensioners in March.

Edinburgh, 16th January 1922.—At a meeting of the Property Sub-Committee of the Trinity Hospital Committee.

Present:—Judge Wallace Dunlop, Councillors Sawers, Adams, Dickson, George Stark, Kemp, and Poole.

There was submitted a Representation by the Treasurer of Trinity Hospital, as to ground used as a children's playground at Iona Street.

On 13th May 1902 the Magistrates and Council authorised the laying out at Iona Street of two acres of ground for recreation purposes. This ground was then in the Burgh of Leith, and the cost of laying out (£1711, 16s. 11d.) was met by Trinity Hospital. The ordinary maintenance has also been charged to Trinity Hospital, and in 1920–21 this amounted to £185, 18s. 10d.

The Sub-Committee, after consideration, resolved to recommend that an offer should be made to the Corporation to lease the ground to them for a period of fifty years from Whitsunday first, at a nominal rent of £1 per annum, on condition that it is maintained as a recreation ground during the whole period of the lease.
